Students may include Vocational Education and Training (VET) in their VCE and VCAL.

Students can do nationally recognised training through a VCAA approved VCE VET program as an apprenticeship or traineeship or any other VET qualification, and receive credit towards their VCE or VCAL.

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This is how VET is different

Here are the top ten differences between a VCE VET program and a VCE study as a VCAL unit.

- 1. An extra qualification**
You can gain a nationally recognised VET qualification and a certificate prior to VCE or VCAL. The national VET qualification meets a Registered Training Organisation, such as a TAFE.
- 2. Connected to the workplace**
VET qualifications give you industry experience and real-world skills. The certificate also makes for a smooth transition between training and work.
- 3. Practical**
VET can strengthen your education by giving you the opportunity to gain practical skills and experience in your chosen field of interest. For example, if you want to be an engineer and you're studying VCE Physics and VCE Mathematical Methods, you can develop practical skills, technical knowledge and industry insight by doing an VET engineering.
- 4. Skills of competency**
Skills of competency are the building blocks that make up a VET qualification. Each unit of competency includes specific skills and knowledge.
- 5. Competency based assessment**
VET students are assessed as 'competent' or 'not yet competent' in each unit of competency. To be assessed as competent, you must show a consistent application of all skills and knowledge in the standard unit of competency.

The skills and you are ready to begin your career or continue with further study, apprenticeship, traineeship or a full or part-time tertiary education.

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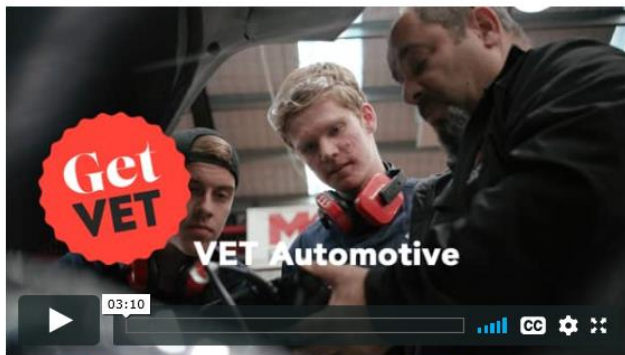

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VCAA advice on scored assessment

- Adjusted dates gives more time for practical assessment.
- Scored unit 3 and 4 sequences have been reviewed to determine the amount of learning of a practical nature.

VCAA advice on VET provision

- Remote learning where possible
- On site assessment for practical activities subject to CHO and DET advice may be possible
- Change unit delivery sequencing
- Change unit selection, import knowledge based unit/s more suited to remote learning
- VCAA is exploring other options around award of VCE and VCAL where Sufficient VET can't be completed.

Structured Workplace Learning Recognition

- **The time spent in a workplace on SWL related to a VCE VET program can be reduced for 2020 in order to access credit towards the VCE or VCAL for Workplace Learning Recognition.**
- **Students will still be required to reflect on the number of units of competency identified in either the VCE VET program specific or generic Apprenticeship or Traineeship Workplace Learning Record.**
- **Schools are able to make a judgement as to what constitutes a reasonable exposure to a workplace.**
- **It is also possible to defer completion of the Workplace Learning Record until later in the year.**

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
