Code and title - Skill Standard (SS)

Purpose: Title of SS which should directly state the job function being described. SS code should follow a similar naming convention to that of UoCs, and include an indicator as to whether the SS is classified as Foundational, Cross Sectoral or Specialist.

Format: Brief phrase and 10 character alphanumeric code.

Description	Purpose: Provides a brief summary of the Skill Standard and how the skills described within the Skills Standard apply to the competent performance of the job function. The description should be written in a way that enables the skills described within the Skills Standard to be applied in a range of vocational contexts. Format: 1-3 sentences.						
Applicable industries	Purpose: Indicates key industries in which this job function is performed, and the Skills Standard is relevant to. Should also indicate the key job roles which perform the job function, and are relevant to this Skills Standard. Both industries and job roles should be linked to those contained within the Australian Skills Classification (ASC). Format: 1-2 brief paragraphs. Qualifications and Skill Purpose: Automatically integrated into TGA functionality to indicate which qualifications Sets that use this Skill and skill sets use the Skill Standard. Standard Format: Live updating list of dot points linked to TGA functionality. Skills and knowledge **Purpose:** Describes the essential job performance outcomes, in terms of the summary demonstration of skills and application of relevant knowledge. The skills summary outcomes should be listed in an order that makes sense to the completion of job outcomes associated with Skills Standard. Note: Industry specific context is provided in the related Training and Assessment Requirements and should not be included here. Format: A combined list of essential skills and underpinning knowledge written in a way that explicitly demonstrates how the knowledge links to the application of skills. Dotpoints are numbered to promote clear line of sight/mapping to requirements as listed in the TAR. Standardised wording: Learners are required to demonstrate the following skills and knowledge: e.g. Foundation skills Purpose: Describes the foundational skills and knowledge that facilitate the successful performance outcomes of the Skill Standard. The capabilities should align to the principles of the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF) and use indicators and performance features to describe the level of performance that is expected across each required capability. Also includes a leadline that clarifies that foundation skill levels are listed at the outcome level, following the completion of the Skills Standard. The capabilities should align to the principles of the Digital Literacy Skills Framework (DLSF) and use indicators and performance features to describe the level of performance that is expected across each required capability.
